# Reflection...

The first reading today is from the Book of the Prophet Malachi; where he strongly states: "If you don't listen to me, I will make your life awful!" This is often how God acts in our lives. Our lives become so awful that finally we think of the Lord and wonder what He wants of us and if we are being faithful. Malachi asks us "Why then do we break faith with one another, violating the covenant of our fathers?" This is a message for all of us, even today. Do we keep the covenant of the Lord? Are we faithful to the teachings of Scripture and of the Church? If we are not faithful, why?

The second reading is from the First Letter to the Thessalonians. One important point in this reading is this: "In receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word but, as it truly is, the word of God." This is so important for each of us to understand! We speak in human words and yet we can receive the word of God. This is particularly true when we read the human words of the Scripture and by faith believe that God is revealing Himself. Today many people no longer believe that Scripture is God's revelation. We Catholics believe with our whole being that the Scriptures are the Revelation of God.

Yet it is important to understand how these Scriptures are God's Revelation. We are not literalists in the sense that we believe that every word is a revelation. Rather, we embrace a theory of revelation which tells us that God is present and speaking to us in His Scriptures. To understand the Scriptures we must understand the people who wrote them, the times in which they were written, the history of these writings and so forth. But that never takes away from the reality that we believe that in hearing these words, in reading these words, we are encountering the Lord God revealing Himself to us.

The Gospel today is from the Gospel of St. Matthew. Here we encounter this teaching: "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." We should always keep this teaching in our hearts and in our minds. We must seek to serve one another, not dominate one another. We should seek to proclaim this word of God in the way we live and relate to one another. The more humble we become, the possible it is for God's word and God's presence to be known by others. Our challenge is to live the word of God in such a way that others are drawn to God.



# Re-Introduction of the Distribution of the Blood of Christ (Blessed Wine) At Weekend Mass and other Liturgical changes being implemented in Our Parish with effect from November 2023

Dear Parishioners and Guests,

We are re-introducing the distribution of the Blood of Christ during Communion at all our Weekend Masses with effect from this weekend; going back to pre-Covid days (as shown in the diagram below). As such, we urge you to please take note & follow the new system accordingly.

We have also made some changes to the liturgical flow at weekend Masses; these are introduced to help enhance our weekend worship and allow greater focus on the Liturgy of the Word (readings) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (the breaking and sharing of the Body and Blood of Christ). As such, we urge all of you to please take note of these changes:

- 1. To prevent spillage of the blessed wine (Blood of Christ), please be guided that:
  - You can come up to receive Holy Communion only when the presiding priest and his accompanying Communion Minister (who is carrying the blessed wine), returns to the Altar after they finish distributing Communion to those who are unable to walk up.
  - Intinction, which is the act of dipping the Blessed bread into the vessel holding the Blood of Christ, is not permitted in our Parish (particularly because any spill of the blessed wine will fall on carpet; hence we would not be able to respectfully and reverently remove all traces of it from the carpeted floor.
- 2. Musicians are requested to receive Communion after everyone in the congregation has had theirs (this is so that they will be able to play the Communion hymn right after the presiding priest receives his Communion). For this purpose, choir members can take turns to receive their Communion with the rest of the congregation.
- 3. At all weekend Masses; the Liturgical Team of Readers and Communion Ministers will be seated together in the 1st pew on the left hand side of the Altar, throughout the Mass.
